Television Production is a complex creative process in which people and machines interact to bring a variety of messages and experiences to an audience. In today's society, people are instant messaging, e-mailing, or blogging and that means you need to know how to present yourself; and in doing so, people can become frustrated and/or nervous as to what is accepted and considered proper. Whatever editing and posting takes place people are judging.

The common elements of the television process include such concepts as storyboarding, producing, directing, camera operation, digital recording, graphics, digital editing and control room production activities. Many of the disciplines can be described, explained and tested in precise objective terms. Almost every production element requires hands on practice to become proficient; therefore, training with equipment is vital to the successful operation of the production.

We are not only concerned with the techniques of production but also with the disciplines of television production; those important professional attitudes and behaviors involving responsibility, integrity, respect, motivation and hard work.

Throughout this class, many assignments will be given. The projects that will be assigned based on time constraints and ability which will assist you throughout your college career or entry level position. I would like for you to find and feel comfortable with your style and technique; therefore when producing you need to communicate your thoughts and ideas. Through guided practice, students gain experience in using equipment that could lead to entry level employment in industry.
