#### **Creative Writing**

#### Prerequisite:

• Successful completion of English I and II

The Creative Writing course is intended for college bound eleventh and twelfth grade students who have a solid grasp of writing narrative prose and poetry. The course is focused on the categories of Fiction, Non-Fiction, Poetry, Non-Traditional, and Daily Activities. Each quarter the students will get a chance to write in all categories, thus developing skills over the span of the entire year. Depending on writing level and interest, students will be challenged with tasks such as screenplays, spoken word poetry, blogs, podcasts, as well as varying styles of fiction and non-fiction. Student writing will also be submitted to local and national writing contests.

Creative Writing requires students to communicate effectively; sharing work and emphasizing appropriate style and voice as well as the conventions of standard English grammar and punctuation. The course also requires students to analyze and edit pieces of written work that parallel pre-collegiate and collegiate level assignments. The capstone will be the production and publication of the school's literary magazine, featuring works from the students' own portfolios. All students will be expected to write, share, edit, and present their work to their peers.
