The Scranton School Board of Directors held a regular meeting on Monday, May 4, 2015 at 7:00pm prevailing time in the auditorium of Scranton High School, 63 Munchak Way, Scranton, PA 18508.

President Douaihy called the meeting to order at 7:04pm with a Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Roll Call: By the Secretary.

Present: Directors Casey, Donahue, Duffy, Martinelli, McAndrew, Oleski, Ruane and President

Douaihy.

Absent: Director Sheridan.

Communications to the Board:

Attorney Minora announced executive sessions were held on Monday, April 27, 2015 and this evening, Monday, May 4, 2015 to discuss Personnel, Litigation and Real Estate.

Visiting Delegations:

Kara Seitzinger, taxpayer and parent of student with peanut allergy at St. Paul's addressed the board regarding the lack of school nurse at St. Paul's and the health and safety of all the children in the Scranton School District and the Diocese of Scranton.

Attorney Minora spoke of our required mandates and has been in contact with the Diocese of Scranton regarding this issue and our staffing levels are inside the state required minimum. Mr. Minora added that by law we're not required to provide anything other than height, weight, hearing and vision; we go above and beyond that even though we're not mandated by law.

Mr. Minora further added that he and Mr. Marichak checked surrounding districts and they discovered that the Scranton School District is providing more nursing services to private and catholic schools than any other surrounding school district; our staffing levels are exceptional and well within the state mandated levels.

President Douaihy asked Mr. Minora if he has done any research with regard to the law.

Attorney Minora indicated that he contacted Sweets, Katz, Stevens and Williams law firm which specializes in this type of law and they specifically told them that in October 2014 that the PA School Code as amended Section 14-1402 states each child of school age shall be given by methods established by the Advisory Health Board a vision test, hearing test, measurement of height and weight, etc., and we do provide that service and then some.

Director McAndrew said that he sympathizes with Mrs. Seitzinger and understands food allergens and cross contact and he knows that since 1997 the CDC says that there is a 50% increase in food allergens and allergies with children. Mr. McAndrew added that he doesn't know if we're doing enough, we are doing what we're supposed and that can be debated but he thinks with these hidden disabilities like allergies and diabetes he thinks we should come together and provide more services if we can.

President Douaihy asked how we would pay for that.

Director McAndrew said he isn't suggesting someone be hired but maybe look at some staffing and move some nursing people around to the schools and reassess what we have to do.

More discussion continued regarding nurse staffing in non public schools and Director Duffy understands the strain we're under, he has reached out to the Diocese and the Wright Center and we're just starting the process of them assisting us and he thinks we should call a Health & Safety Committee meeting to discuss the problem in its entirety.

Rosemary Boland, SFT President, spoke of the peanut allergies and state mandates and if Director Duffy calls a Health & Safety Committee meeting she hopes her office receives sufficient notice so nurses can attend.

Ms. Boland thanked Erin Keating and John Marichak for their work on the curriculum writing and mapping and added that the SFT will be awarding scholarships at Scranton and West High Schools and wished everyone a wonderful summer.
